The Hub will collaborate with financial institutions, project developers, governments, and research organizations to tackle critical barriers to investment and foster a vibrant, enabling ecosystem for Africa's bioeconomy



Policy and Financial Transition Planning

Supporting a financeenabling policy environment

for the bioeconomy, converting policy strategies¹ into investment roadmaps, financial plans, and sustainable finance regulations, while fostering public-private dialogue.



Capacity Building

Developing African financial leadership in the bioeconomy

through targeted capacity building and advisory, enabling institutions to integrate financial mgmt. with resilience and green transition strategies.



Investment Pipeline
Generation

Strengthening sustainable bioeconomy investment pipelines

through acceleration, blended finance, de-risking, and exploration of innovative financing mechanisms for investment.



Data, Metrics, and Standards

Promoting bioeconomy metrics, KPIs, and standards in the financial sector²,

alongside data and MRV solutions, to drive impactful investment, while integrating market feedback to refine and enhance these tools.


Our first mission: crystallize 2–4 bold bioeconomy focus areas to drive the Hub's impact from day one

Notes: For each use case, the Hub will develop a strategic set of interventions across its four pillars — policy enablement, capacity building, investment pipeline catalysation, and data & metrics — to make its activities and impacts more tangible and focused over the first three years, given the breadth of the bioeconomy agenda.



The next step: collective action plans across the Hub's pillars to guide the path ahead






Each roadmap will specify priority interventions, partnership requirements, funding mechanisms, success metrics, and governance considerations necessary for effective implementation.



Unlocking Finance for Regenerative Agri. & Forestry

- Set up \$400m blended finance de-risking facility to mobilize capital from financial institutions into regen. agriculture and sustainable forestry across Africa.
- Establish \$15m accelerator and TA facility to build pipelines and strengthen local and regional financial institutions.



- Establish Africa's first DSI
 Financing Readiness Roadmap,
 to finance legal, technical, and
 institutional systems for fair
 benefit-sharing.
- Set up an Africa DSI Financing Coalition, uniting governments, IPLCs, financiers, and scientists to mobilize capital and pilot solutions.



- Scale Regenerative School Meals into a national, cofinanced program for nutrition, resilience, and livelihoods.
- Adopt Uganda's first National School Feeding Policy to embed meals in policy, budget, and coordination.


